Early Childhood

Each Early Childhood class meets either in the mornings or afternoons Mondays through Thursdays. We follow the District 25 school calendar.

Children's Circle Classroom:

Designed as a "blended" classroom for children with special needs, those who may be at risk for academic challenges and typically developing children to learn side by side in a typical preschool classroom environment.

Self-Contained Classrooms:

Each year, we provide a variety of supports to meet the needs of students in small structured settings. These classes may vary from year to year based on the needs of the student population at that time. Each class offers supports of related services personnel and opportunities to participate in activities, as appropriate, with the general education classes.

Communications Classroom:

A highly structured teaching program with many visual, sensory, and communication supports. Students in this program have significant communication needs and are supported in this small classroom setting which is often co-taught by a speech and language pathologist.

Phonological Classroom:

A specialized classroom taught two afternoons a week by an early childhood speech and language pathologist for children who exhibit significant speech disorders.
