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Public Hearing concerning the intent of the Board of Education to sell \$40,000,000 Working Cash Fund Bonds

The proposed issuance of the Bonds is for the purpose of building additions to Arlington Heights School District 25 schools.

Business and Finance

2016 Tentative Tax Levy

Ms. Mallek provided information on the proposed 2016 tax levy. Also taken into account are the new construction projects and the bond sale. The taxes are levied on the last known Equalized Assessed Value (EAV), which is the 2014 EAV. Taxes are based on a dollar amount limited to an increase each year of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) or 5%, which ever is less. The total dollar amount that can be extended in the capped funds for 2016 is equal to the dollar amount extended for 2015 increased by the CPI plus new growth. Historically, the District has seen less than 2% actual new growth in the last 10 years. The District can only receive revenue from new growth if it exists. Not levying for new growth that materializes means that the District loses property tax on the amount not levied. It is not expected to see 2% again unless a TIF were to come on. We do not anticipate seeing a decline in EAV because the average increase in assessment for property in Wheeling Township is 16.78%.

Ms. Mallek presented a chart showing historical changes in new growth and assessment, total assessment, and CPI. The proposed levy is 3.9% higher than the 2015 levy extension in the capped funds. This captures the CPI and new growth and accommodates hitting the tax rate ceiling in the education fund. The actual increase is expected to be 1.7%, which represents the .7% CPI plus 1% new growth.

The total tax rate for District 25 is \$3.44 per \$100 of equalized assessed value, about \$.55 per \$100 of equalized assessed value less than the prior year.

Ms. Mallek said a hearing and levy adoption would be a part of the November 17th school board meeting.

Employee Benefits Renewal 2017

Ms. Mallek reported the insurance renewal information had been received from GCG Financial and shared with the district insurance committee. Renewal for medical insurance has proposed increases. The committee is working to control the costs of medical insurance by considering changes in benefits. Vision insurance is also anticipated to have an increase in premiums, but the committee may recommend going with a different plan. We are looking at a change in provider for the Flexible Benefit Plan. No changes in premiums are anticipated for dental insurance and life insurance.
