This presentation updated the Board on how our schools performed on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. The MAP Assessment test measures both achievement and growth over time. MAP tests math and reading for grades 2-8 yearly. District 25 values the comprehensive information provided by the MAP assessment that allows the Department of Student Learning to reflect to help inform instruction.

The Illinois State Board of Education provides a yearly assessment of the District's implementation of the requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), to ensure that districts are performing with respect to the provision of special education and related services.

Based on data from the 2017-18 school year, Arlington Heights School District 25 was assessed in seven areas of the state's performance plan and received a score of 4.0 in each area, with an overall score of 4.0 or "Meets Requirements." This is the highest designation available.
