# Successes

- Remote Learning – Day 1!!!!
- People
  - DSL Coordinators
  - Volunteers and Offers of Help from Families & Staff
- Food Service
  - Quickly increased to 1,200 bags weekly
  - 14 meals per bag
  - 80,000+ meals by April 30th
- Technology
  - 500 devices distributed/delivered
  - MS student devices
  - Continual repair and replacement

## Survey Data

### Teachers

Though it isn't the same as being in school, the current RL3.0 format has been a positive and productive experience for my students:

78.2%	Strongly Agree/Agree
20.2%	Neutral
1.6%	Disagree

The most challenging part of Remote Learning for me has been:

6.9%	Planning with my colleagues
12.2%	Not having enough online interaction with my students
19.7%	It takes too much time to plan and implement
14.4%	I feel like I could/should be doing more
46.8%	Other individual reasons

# Survey Data

## Summary of Comments from Teachers

- Difficulty finding balance between work and home
- Interest in staying with RL3.0 format instead of changing the process another time.
- Meeting the needs of parents when different homes have opposite expectations.
- Missing students; not knowing how students are doing with their learning; not being able to monitor or interact with students enough; some students are not participating nor completing work
- Utilizing online platforms takes much more time, and is more difficult; loopholes on who participates exist with Zoom
- Significant amount of meetings; feel I can't get away from the computer; often working longer days than during a regular school/work day



## Survey Data

### Parents

Though it isn't the same as being in school, the current RL3.0 format has been a positive and productive experience for my child:

51.6%	Strongly agree/Agree
28.7%	Neutral
19.7%	Disagree/Strongly Disagree

The most challenging part of Remote Learning for me and my child has been:

29.7%	Not having enough online interaction with the teacher
18.1%	Not having enough work to do
09.5%	Understanding what to do
03.9%	Having too much work/taking too much time
38.8%	Other individual reasons

# Survey Data

## Summary of Comments from Parents

- Difficulty finding balance between work and home
- Interest in more live, but remote interaction between teacher and students as well as among students.
- Interest in significantly more online instruction on a daily basis
- Interest in a more consistent platform; a more consistent way to find all resources in one place with passwords being the same
- Interest in more teletherapy and direct contact for students with special needs
- Concerned about loss of academic gain and how it will be recovered
