DASHBOARD: District 25's COVID-19 #s

DEFINITIONS

POSITIVE Includes individuals with a lab-confirmed COVID-positive test.

EXCLUSION Individuals excluded from school due to <u>isolation</u> or <u>quarantine</u>.

Isolation: an individual who is symptomatic or an individual who has tested positive for COVID-19 who is separated from others.

ested positive for COVID-19 who is separated from others

Quarantine: exposure to a positive or probable COVID-19 individual.

 - Sharing the document camera so in-person and remote students can participate in a lesson
 - Using the annotation setting in Zoom with a document camera so it is easy to view for in-person and remote students
 - Anchor chart; using the webcam for in-person and remote students to collaborate
 - Using the spotlight feature in Zoom so in-person and remote students can share work


