- 75% of USA students are FDK
 - Range from 92% (HI) to 24% (UT)
 - 70% of Illinois students are FDK
 - Growing interest in FDK in Chicago suburbs
 - FDK = D26, D54, D59, D220, Northbrook
 - HDK = D15, D21 D23, AHSD25, D57



- Districts that have transitioned to FDK
 - Have space available
 - Charge tuition or impact budget
- AHSD25 parents have shared that
 - FDK is desired at home schools
 - FDK would be more affordable than child care
 - Teachers are highly regarded



- FDK students have larger end-of-year gains in reading and math when compared with HDK.
- FDK long term achievement benefits are significant for at-risk learners (low income, EL, developmental delay)
- AHSD25 teachers would use more time to expand current topics, not add to the curriculum topics.



- FDK creates more 1-1 interaction, parent reporting, planning opportunity, records maintenance.
- Instructional practices seen more in FDK include childinitiated activities, more support for individual work, less large group work, more play-based reinforcement



- FDK gains begin to dissipate in 1st grade
- FDK gains are completely eliminated by 3rd grade
- No current measurable long-term achievement benefits for FDK over HDK for typical learners
- High school data for AHSD25 students is significant



- FDK social-emotional benefit research is mixed
 - Shows benefits in some areas
 - Shows detrimental impact in some areas
 - Some is difficult to assess/ demonstrate

Survey

1. Do not impact taxes (operational nor building)

2. Ensure ALL students have access (cost and location)

3. Ensure sustainability



Needs

- Insufficient space for current enrollment
- Further insufficient space for projected enrollment
- Insufficient staff for classroom and fine arts/pe
- Cost prohibitive to budget
 - Tuition would need to cover own child and costs for low-income enrollment

- Staffing Increase = Annual Estimated \$1,250,000+
 - 20+ FTE Teachers
 - Classroom teachers
 - PE, Art, Music
 - Support Staff
 - Recess, lunch, support services
