The process:

- General informational meeting (today)
- Team discussion about your child's strengths and needs
- School/program observation (optional)
- IEP meeting during school year
- May - meet the kindergarten team and revise IEP, if needed (parents optional).
- August 2020 First Day of Kindergarten

Registration Process

1. Use link to pre-register
2. School Admin Assistants will send packet in the mail
3. Drop off paperwork at kindergarten school on
Wednesday January 23 9:30-11:00, 4:00-6:30
4. May - you will receive snap code via email.
5. Go online to complete registration.
6. Kindergarten teams will have an information night and screening day in August.

Acronyms and definitions:

Home school - your neighborhood school

Instructional Class - small group of students with similar strengths and needs that can learn in small groups and integrate into the general educational class

Resource Teacher - Special Education Teacher

IEP - Individualized Education Plan

LRE - Least Restrictive Environment

Pull out - services are provided in a small room out of the general ed classroom

Push in - services are provided within the general education classroom

Staff:Student Ratios - instruction provided in 1:1, 1:3 small group, 1:20 classroom

Continuum of Services:

General education kindergarten without services and supports (no IEP)

General education kindergarten with services and supports

Instructional kindergarten class with supports in general education classroom

Instructional self-contained classroom in public day school

Instructional self-contained classroom in private day school

Residential placement

Educational Service and Placement Page

- All students in District 25 schools participate in general education classroom activities.
- The minutes of therapy services and general education services are listed in the Individualized Education Plan.

General Education Kindergarten with no services or supports

Where: every elementary school

Hours: ½ day program from 9:05-11:50 or 12:50-3:35

Students: approximately 20 students per classroom

Staff: One General Education Teacher

Activities: Language Arts, Math, Art, Music, Physical Education (PE), Library Media Center (LMC), Recess







General Education Kindergarten with services or supports

Where: every elementary school

Hours: ½ day program from 9:05-11:50 or 12:50-3:35

Students: approximately 20 students per classroom

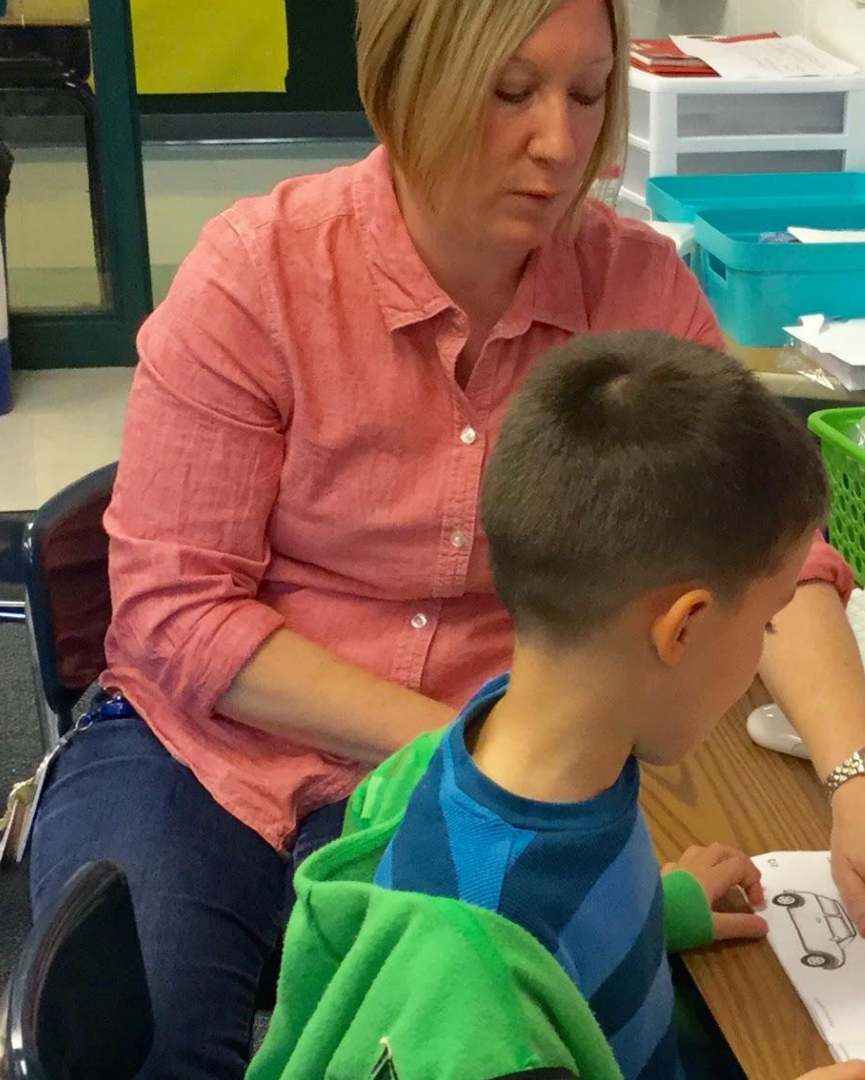
Staff: One General Education Teacher in classroom, Support staff per IEP

Services: IEP minutes with Resource Teacher and/or Therapist addressing a goal for a specific need (e.g. academic, behavior, organization, language, fine motor). Services are delivered in pull out or push in model per IEP.

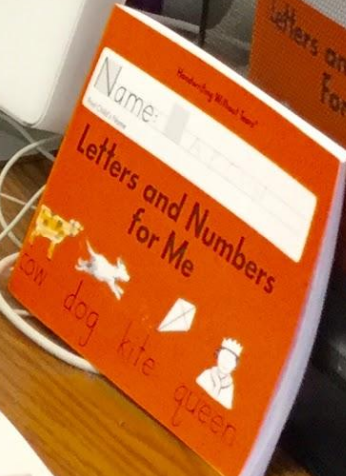
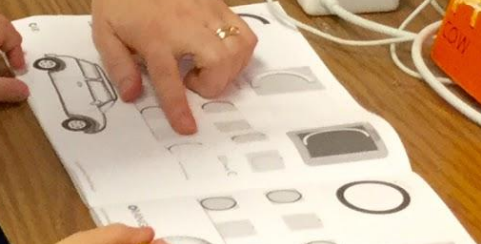

Integrated Services (IS)

Where: Westgate School

Hours: ½ day program

Students: approximately 6-10 students per class

Staff: Special Education Teacher, Teaching Assistants, SLP, OT, SW, Psych

Activities: Academic instruction is provided in small group pull-out and whole group push-in with team approach of General Education and Special Education Teacher.

Where: Windsor School

Students: approximately 10 students per multi-grade class

Staff: Special Education Teacher, Teaching Assistants, SLP, OT, PT, SW, Psych

Activities: Academic instruction typically with alternate curriculum is provided in 1:1, small group (1:3) and large group (3:10). Daily integration with TA support into general education classes of music, art, PE, LMC and special activities.

Communications

Where: Windsor School

Students: approximately 6 students per class

Staff: Special Education Teacher, Teaching Assistants, SLP, OT, PT, SW, Psych

Activities: Academic instruction, alternate curriculum may be used, is provided in 1:1, small group (1:2) and large group (3:6). Daily integration with TA support into general education classes of music, art, PE, LMC and special activities.







Instructional self-contained classroom in public day school

Where: [NSSEO schools](#) (Miner, Timber Ridge)

Hours: full day program

Students: approximately 10 students per multi-grade class

Staff: Special Education Teacher, Teaching Assistants, SLP, OT, PT, SW, Psych

Activities: Academic instruction with alternate curriculum is provided in 1:1, small group (1:2) and large group (3:10). Fully integrated therapy to ensure generalization of skills. Academic, behavioral, functional life skills are focus. Integration opportunities into community are provided. Strong family component.

Instructional self-contained classroom in private day school

Where: Private Schools

Hours: full day program

Activities: Academic instruction with very specific focus (e.g. learning disabilities, autism)

Residential Setting

Where: Private schools with residential living arrangements

Activities: Functional, behavior, personal care and academic instruction.

- May - meet the kindergarten team and revise IEP, if needed (parents optional).
- August 2020 is First Day of Kindergarten
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FAQs:

1. My child has not had IEP meeting yet. Will I miss registration deadlines?
 - You will not miss any registration deadlines. Your child is already a student in D25 so we are aware of their kindergarten status.
 - Early registration for kindergarten provides enrollment information to D25 to ensure we have adequate classrooms and staffing.
2. What happens if I register at one school and the IEP team determines another school is more appropriate for my child?
 - We will adjust the registration and refund any fees that were paid.
3. Can we stay at Greenbrier Early Childhood program?
 - Students must register for kindergarten if they are 5 years old by Sept 1st.
4. What happens to the IEP if I chose to keep my child in private preschool?
 - I will contact you in August if you chose not to register for kindergarten. We will complete a revocation of consent to stop the IEP.
 - If you or the team feels that your child may need support when they re-enter D25 schools, the team will complete a screening to determine if a reevaluation is required to determine current skills and if supports are needed.
