Article 1: The Opportunity Myth

Core Idea

The Opportunity Myth argues that millions of students are denied real opportunities to learn—not because they lack ability or motivation, but because schools often **underestimate** what they can do. Students are frequently given schoolwork that is **far below grade level**, limiting their potential and reinforcing inequity.

What the Study Found

Researchers observed classrooms, analyzed assignments, and gathered feedback from thousands of students. They discovered four things students need every day to succeed:

- 1. Grade-appropriate assignments
- 2. **Strong instruction** that empowers students to do the thinking
- 3. **Deep engagement** in learning
- 4. Teachers who hold high expectations

However, most students—especially Black, Latino, and low-income students—rarely received all four.

Article 2: 10 Principles for Schools of Modern Learning

The 10 Principles of Schools for Modern Learning emphasize creating a dynamic, student-centered environment that fosters personal, self-determined learning through shared beliefs, co-constructed curriculum, and real-world application. Key principles include using technology as an amplifier, prioritizing transparency, and encouraging community participation to develop agile, lifelong learners prepared for a constantly evolving world.

10 Principles of Modern Learning (Super Simple Version)

1. Students Come First

Learning starts with you and what you care about.

2. We Learn Together

We get smarter by talking, sharing, and helping each other.

3. We Learn Skills for Life

We practice thinking, solving problems, being creative, and working with others.

4. Learning Should Feel Real

We learn by doing real things that matter, not just worksheets.

5. You Have a Voice

You get to make choices and share your ideas.

6. Teachers Are Helpers

Teachers guide and support—you are part of the learning team.

7. Learning Can Happen Anywhere

We learn in class, at home, online, outside—learning is everywhere.

8. Feedback Helps Us Grow

Mistakes help us learn. We reflect and try again.

9. Everyone Works Together

Families, teachers, and students support each other.

10. We Keep Improving

We learn, grow, and try new things all the time.

Article 3: State of the Student Experience

Many students today are working hard, but they are not always feeling **motivated**, **connected**, **or inspired** by school. Schools are full of caring adults, yet the structure of school itself often makes learning feel more about **performance** than **growth**.

What Students Are Experiencing

- **High stress** from grades and expectations
- Learning that can feel repetitive or disconnected from real life
- Limited choice in what or how they learn
- Inconsistent relationships with adults who know them well
- Not enough opportunities to collaborate, create, or explore interests

What Students Say Helps Them Learn

Students learn best when they:

- Feel known and supported
- See purpose in what they are learning
- Have **choice** and ownership
- Work with others and solve **real problems**
- Get **feedback** that helps them grow, not just a grade
