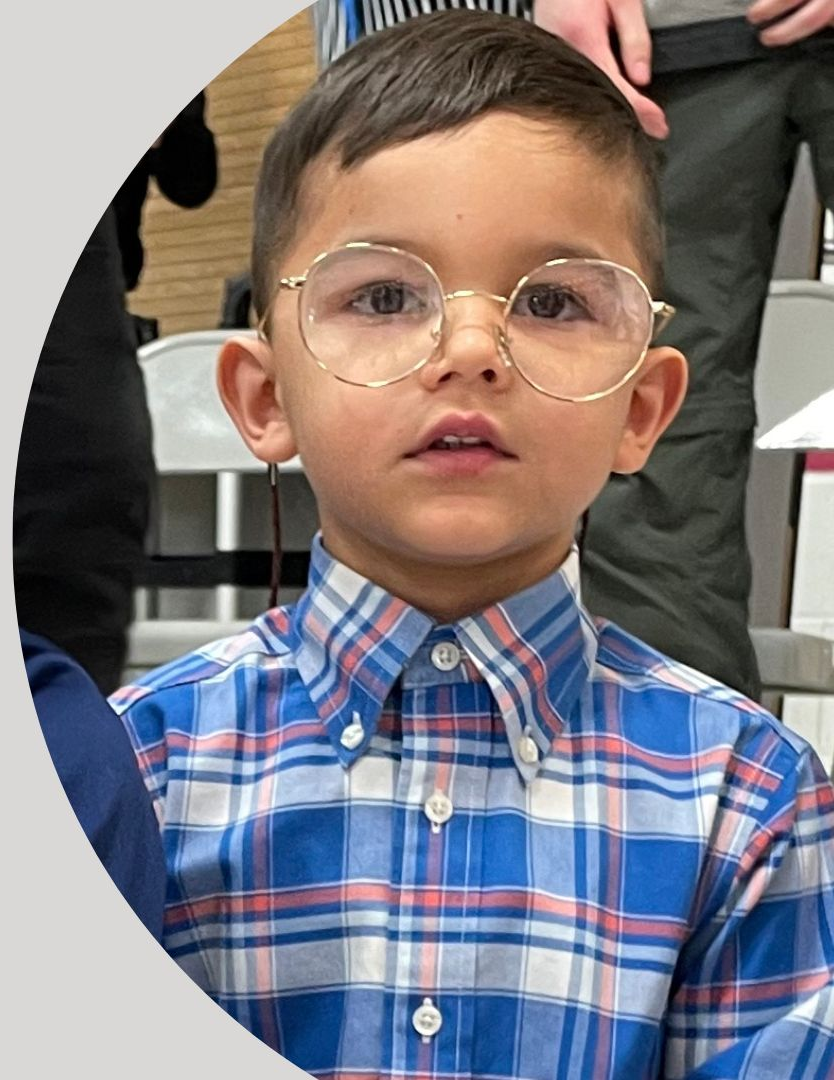

REQUIRED PROCEDURES

POSITIVE CASE of COVID19



Treated like a typical absence:

- Except must isolate from school for 5 calendar days
 - From onset of symptoms OR positive test (whichever occurred first)
 - Home test or lab test is acceptable
 - Please notify absence line/nurse reason for absence
- May request homework on School Day 3 of absence
 - Work sent to office to be picked up after school
 - Student submits missed work per teacher direction
 - Some classrooms may list info on learning platforms or teacher webpage; check with teacher.

REMOTE OPTION



Districts **REQUIRED** to offer. Parents **NOT** REQUIRED to utilize.

- During student's school exclusion dates
 - This is an optional service for those who want their child engaged with a certified teacher during isolation.
 - Grade spans (depending on # of students) will participate synchronously with an Academy Program teacher for a half day.
 - Academy Program work is not turned in.
 - Student works asynchronously for a half day.
 - Some asynchronous sites provided.
 - Student may work on classwork provided by teacher.

COVID-19 Community Level	Individual- and household-level prevention behaviors

High

- Wear a well-fitting mask¹ indoors in public, regardless of vaccination status (including in K-12 schools and other indoor community settings)
- If you are immunocompromised or [high risk](#) for severe disease
 - Wear a [mask or respirator](#) that provides you with greater protection
 - Consider avoiding non-essential indoor activities in public where you could be exposed
 - Talk to your healthcare provider about whether you need to take other precautions (e.g., testing)
 - Have a plan for rapid testing if needed (e.g., having home tests or access to testing)
 - Talk to your healthcare provider about whether you are a candidate for treatments like oral antivirals, PrEP, and monoclonal antibodies

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

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- Changes per Recent Updates
 - Individual case notification
 - Data notification/Dashboard
 - Testing facilitated by Parents/Guardians
 - Daily cleaning will return to high-touch surfaces
- Flexibility is Important
 - Notify families if an outbreak is definitely attributed to school
 - Notify families if significant outbreak occurs; changes may or may not be needed.
 - A person may wear an appropriate mask at any time (see IHSA safety for sports)
 - A person may request a desk shield
