Dear Arlington Heights School District 25 Staff and Families:

Thank you for continuing to support our students, staff, and families as we continue our transition to the hybrid model of instruction. It has been heart-warming to see students of all ages excited to be at school. It has been amazing to see teachers implementing lessons in a whole new way. AHSD25 is a wonderful community, and the collaboration among schools and families at this time is another example of why this is a great place to learn and work.

I have updates on a few different topics in this letter:

Transition Advisory Committee Update

At this week's meeting, the Transition Advisory Committee again discussed metrics to consider that would guide a move to full in-person learning. However, the committee was unable to agree upon metrics that they would recommend. Therefore, the Board of Education and I will discuss next steps at the Special Meeting scheduled for Thursday, October 29, 2020. I'd like to thank the committee members for their continued work on behalf of their neighbors, colleagues, and our students.

Step 3 | Hybrid Learning Model - Data Update

Northwestern University, Illinois COVID Data by Zip Code

District 25 used Northwestern's new cases (14-day) per 100,000 population statistic as one data point to determine it was safe to move into the hybrid learning model we are currently in. The Harvard Global Institute (HGHI) risk level range was based on daily numbers, which we converted to a 7-day range. Northwestern has since changed the way they calculate the 14-day data. It was a 2 week average and is now a 14-day converted total count to align with the CDC guidance. The Transition Advisory Committee recommends using Northwestern's 7-day converted count so that we continue to compare "apples to apples" as we compare this data.

The metric range based on research from the Harvard Global Institute for Health <u>has not changed</u> and remains at <u>75-175 cases per 100,000 population</u> for 7-days.

These metrics were used to determine when District 25 could move into the Hybrid environment. There are no specific metrics to determine if we should move back to a Remote environment. Instead, we would move back to a Remote environment if (1) mandated by the Governor or the Illinois Department of Public Health or (2) if our internal District 25 Covid19 cases and numbers of student/staff exclusions showed an increasing trend at a specific school or throughout the district.

As a visual demonstration, the chart below compares the different data resources we have taken into consideration to move into the Hybrid Model.

In the meantime, we move forward with the current hybrid model.
