





# INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS ACROSS ALL DISTRICT BUILDINGS

Our buildings are aging and in need of important and costly life safety and capital project updates. These updates include HVAC & Boilers, electrical, roofing, plumbing, security, paving, and other upgrades and improvements.

Our school district is a destination for students and families.

We've achieved this while remaining one of the most fiscally responsible school districts in Illinois.

The \$75 million referendum would fund a construction plan that would build the space needed for a full day kindergarten program as well as ensure our buildings have the space and are in the condition to continue to support the always growing Arlington Heights community.



# **VOTING** Where, When, How?

It's that time again to let your voice be heard at the polls. This year's election, however, is a little different. Rather than the election being held in March, like usual, this election is being held in late June. This is due to Senate Bill 25, passed by the Illinois General Assembly in 2021 that moved the primary election date in Illinois from March 15 to June 28.

The reason for the move was to accommodate the delayed 2020 Census data, due to the **COVID-19 pandemic.**

### **GOING ON VACATION? VOTE EARLY!**

The June 28 election falls right before the July 4 holiday weekend. You might be heading out of town, or you might not have time to head out and vote as you prepare for the holiday weekend. If that is the case, consider voting early. You can vote early at the Arlington Heights Village Hall 7 days a week beginning June 13, and at the Rolling Meadows Courthouse (room 238) beginning June 1.
