Dear Arlington Heights School District 25 Families:

Thank you for completing the Remote Learning 3.0 Survey distributed last week. We will be reviewing the data over the weekend, and will share a summary of the results with you as soon as possible.

Below is some other general information to share:

- Families will soon receive information from your building principal about how to pick up your child's belongings from school. Basically, it will be a drive-up system, like Food Distribution Wednesdays. We will have packed up your child's materials. You will simply drive up in the circle drive near the front entrance, tell us your last name, and we will load the materials into your trunk. There will also be stations where you can return any library books, textbooks, and technology devices.  
Most schools will be doing this during the 1<sup>st</sup> week of June. However, Dryden and Patton Schools will be doing this in mid-May so that we can prepare for summer construction needs. (Dryden and Patton families will hold onto any checked-out technology devices until June.)
- Families of 8<sup>th</sup> graders will have the opportunity to pick up Graduation Gowns in early May. If you do not wish to pick up your child's gown, you will receive a reimbursement for the cost. Additionally, you will soon receive information on how to help us celebrate our graduates through a virtual graduation. The date for Virtual Graduation 2020 has been moved to Friday, June 5, 2020 at 7:00 pm.
- Refunds for Summer University, partial bus transportation for paid riders, and field trips that didn't occur are being processed. All families should see their reimbursements by June 30, 2020. - D25 Remote Learning Plan 3.0 is designed to support our students' social and emotional well-being, continue academic progress, and prepare them for success in subsequent grade levels until we may return to school. The following grading scale is based on the principle of "no educational harm to any child" from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) Remote Learning Recommendations During COVID-19 Emergency. Upon our return to school, students will be assessed for learning gaps, and instruction will be adjusted to fill those gaps.

Remote Learning Grading Scale for 3 <sup>rd</sup> Trimester (K-5) & 4 <sup>th</sup> Quarter (6-8)	
<b>P</b>	<b>Pass:</b> Student showed <u>any</u> evidence of learning or engagement during the remote learning timeframe. The type of evidence of learning a student provides may be differentiated based upon student circumstances.
<b>NGP</b>	<b>No Grade due to Pandemic:</b> No evidence of student learning was submitted due to Remote Learning related circumstances.

There will be one overall grade (P or NGP) for each student (not one grade for every single subject).
